Mr. Dillinger noted these 2.86 million is from the proceeds for the sale of the sanitary sewer system. He indicated that by prepaying the loan the Borough should save \$55,000 In 2014. Interest income on the investment does not cover the interest payments on the loan. For every \$5.00 in interest paid on the loan the investment is only covering \$1.00 of that cost.
