MINUTES OF THE REGULAR MEETING OF WHITE OAK BOROUGH COUNCIL HELD MONDAY, FEBRUARY 15, 2010 AT 8:00 P.M.

CALL TO ORDER

Mr. Pasternak, President of Council, called the Regular Meeting to order at 8:00 p.m.

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

Mr. Pasternak led those attending in the Pledge of Allegiance.

ROLL CALL

Attending were Council members: Edward Babyak, Charles Davis, George Dillinger, Ronald Massung, David Pasternak, Kenneth Robb and Carrie Verbanick. Also attending were Mayor Ina Jean Marton, Solicitor Terry Leckman, Engineer Representative Donald Hultberg, Borough Manager John W. Petro, Jr. and Borough Secretary Nancy Greenland.

MINUTES

Mr. Pasternak asked if there were any additions or corrections to the following Minutes:

EXECUTIVE SESSION

Mr. Leckman stated there were various sessions held and during such sessions pending litigation and personnel matters were discussed.

PUBLIC COMMENTS

Jodi Perozick - 2800 Lincoln Way

Ms. Perozick asked that residents be asked to dig out fire hydrants that are near their homes.

Richard Bryce – Messinger Lane

Mr. Bryce expressed concern on how the Borough would pay back the \$4,500,000.00 recently borrowed, for an extensive road paving program. If the loan is for 10 years that would require a 75% increase in the millage rate. He further stated he did not feel the program was necessary.

Mr. Dillinger indicated the interest rate on the loan is 1.625% and that the full amount of the principal may not be used as the Borough would only do the road that it felt needed to be rehabilitated.

Mr. Bryce stated he felt that the issue needed to be readdressed as Auld Street, which was just done five (5) years ago was on the list for rehabilitation.

REPORTS OF CHAIRPERSONS OF STANDING COMMITTEES

President's Report

Mr. Pasternak, President of Council, noted that McKeesport Area School District, just hired Christy Davis as its Public Relations Officer. He welcomed Ms. Davis to the meeting.

Mr. Pasternak indicated that he has been serving on the Solicitor Search Committee for the South East Tax Collection District in Allegheny County. The committee developed RFP, interviewed seven (7) potential candidates for the position and has forwarded the three (3) candidates to the full Board for consideration. The Board is set to make a selection at the February 25th meeting. Mr. Pasternak further noted that Mr. Petro and Ms. Greenland have been servicing on the By-Laws Committee. The group has just finished preparing a final draft of the proposed by-laws. These will have a preliminary presentation at the February 25th meeting and should be presented at the March meeting for adoption.

HEALTH, ENVIRONMENT AND CABLE

Ms. Verbanick, Chairperson, advised that due to the severe weather conditions last week the recycling and garbage collection were cancelled. The normal schedule will be run this week.

PARKS AND RECREATION

Mr. Robb, Chairperson, noted the contract for outsourcing of the pool concession expired with at the end of the 2009 pool season. The Borough did advertise for Requests for Proposal for the outsourcing. Only one was received.

A motion was made by Mr. Robb, seconded by Mr. Babyak, authorizing the proper officials to prepare and sign the necessary documents for the outsourcing of the pool concession. The agreement will be for one (1) season with options on the next three (3) pool seasons.

Motion carried unanimously.

Mr. Robb announced that Community Day is set for Saturday, August 7th.

PLANNING, ZONING AND CODE ENFORCEMENT

Mr. Babyak, Chairperson, noted there were 8 violation notices and 5 construction permits, 7 residential occupancy permits and 12mechanicial amusement device licenses issued in January for fees totaling \$3,337.00.

A motion was made by Mr. Babyak, seconded by Mr. Robb, accepting the Robert Massie lot consolidation and subdivision located at 1234 Long Run Road. This is contingent upon proper documentation of the executed sales agreement being provided to the Borough. The plan has been reviewed by the Planning Commission and received a favorable recommendation.

Motion carried unanimously.

A motion was made by Mr. Babyak, seconded by Mr. Massung, to reaffirm acceptance of the Wendy's Subdivision. The subdivision was originally approved at the January 19, 2009 Regular Meeting. The reaffirmation is required as the plans were not filed with Allegheny County within the 90 day time limit.

Motion carried unanimously.

PUBLIC SAFETY

Mr. Massung, Chairperson, complimented the Rainbow and White Oak Fire Companies, White Oak EMS and Red Cross Evacuation Team for the great job they did during the heavy snow fall which started on February 5th. He noted that all groups worked hand in hand transporting stranded motorists and residents without power to the shelter site at Rainbow Fire Hall.

Mr. Massung noted the Police Department has updated its firearms and will be attending firearms qualifications in the near future.

Mr. Massung advised the Civil Service Commission met on January 31st.

Mr. Massung commented that anyone interested in forming/working with a historical society should contact the Borough office.

PUBLIC WORKS

Mr. Davis, Chairperson, noted the activity report was available for review during normal business hours.
