RESOLUTIONS AND ORDINANCES

Ms. McGrail read Ordinance No. 3687 by short title for adoption.

O-3687 2013 TAX LEVY

A motion was made by Mr. Dillinger, seconded by Mr. Robb, to table adopt Ordinance No. 3687.

Mr. Dillinger stated the Borough would like to review the numbers more closely. We are trying to keep the revenues below the five (5%) percent windfall. At this time we are using a \$394,000,000 assessed value. There are currently 184 appeals still outstanding, which have an assessed value of \$10,000,000. We are banking on the fact that the remaining appeals will not average a reduce of \$54,000. We are looking at a tax levy rate of 4.66 mills, which should bring in \$65,000 more than last year. This is less than the five (5%) windfall.

Motion carried unanimously.

O-3688 REPEALING ORDINANCE 3476, RESTRICTIONS ON PROCEEDS FROM THE SALE OF WASTEWATER SYSTEM

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Mr. Dillinger noted this fund was set up when the Borough sold the sanitary sewer system. The principal was never touched, but interest income from the investment of the funds was rolled over into the General Fund. He advised the ordinance is being repealed based on the fact that the ordinance requires a referendum which cannot be legally done under current law.

Mr. Robb stated he felt this should be left up to future Councils to repeal the ordinance.

A motion was made by Ms. Noll, seconded by Mr. Dillinger, to adopt Ordinance No. 3688 by short title.

Motion carried with Mr. Robb voting Nay.

Mr. Babyak declared Resolution No. 3686 adopted.

Ms. McGrail read Resolution No. 3689 by short title for adoption.

R-3689 REAL ESTATE TAX REFUND

A motion was made by Mr. Dillinger, seconded by Ms. Noll, to adopt Resolution No. 3689 by short title.

Motion carried unanimously.

NEW BUSINESS

A motion was made by Mr. Dillinger, seconded by Ms. Noll, to eliminate allocation(s) for the position of Borough Manager from the current budget and to terminate the individual holding in that position, effective immediately.

Mr. Dillinger noted ways to reduce expenses have been discussed at a number of meetings in the past.

Mr. Massung stated this is a financial move, which is for the betterment of the Borough.

Mr. Robb stated he felt that this action would because of personality conflicts and would cost the Borough in the end.

Mr. Babyak called for a roll call vote.
