MINUTES OF THE REGULAR MEETING OF WHITE OAK BOROUGH COUNCIL HELD MONDAY, MARCH 15, 2010 AT 8:00 P.M.

CALL TO ORDER

Mr. Pasternak, President of Council, called the Regular Meeting to order at 8:00 p.m.

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

Mr. Pasternak led those attending in the Pledge of Allegiance.

ROLL CALL

Attending were Council members: Edward Babyak, Charles Davis, George Dillinger, Ronald Massung, David Pasternak, Kenneth Robb and Carrie Verbanick. Also attending were Mayor Ina Jean Marton, Solicitor Terry Leckman, Engineer Representative Donald Hultberg, Borough Manager John W. Petro, Jr. and Borough Secretary Nancy Greenland.

MINUTES

Mr. Pasternak asked if there were any additions or corrections to the following Minutes:

A motion was made by Mr. Babyak, seconded by Mr. Massung, to accept the Minutes as presented.

EXECUTIVE SESSION

Mr. Leckman stated there were various sessions held and during such sessions pending litigation and personnel matters were discussed.

PUBLIC COMMENTS

Mike Henschel – 1933 Dearborn Drive

Mr. Henschel stated he was representing the kids that utilize the inline hockey court. He asked that the Borough consider resurfacing the area with a special material as well as filling the cracks in the asphalt. He noted the cracks although they are no wide do interfere with the skate wheels and the course surface wears down the wheels of the skates. The goal posts and nets need to be replaced and he believed there were sections of the wall boards missing. He also asked if the surface could be painted with the appropriate lines. The kids that use the court

Page 1 of 8 Regular Meeting march 2010.doc have volunteered to assist in any renovations as well as putting the wall boards away so they are not in the weather. Most of the activity at the court is from pickup games, He noted that in the summer the kids use the court earlier in the date and later in the evening when it the temperature is not as high. He suggested that additional waste cans be placed at the site.

Mrs. Marton stated it is nice to see that court is being used.

Mr. Pasternak noted the Borough would look into the requesting noting there was no funding for such a project under the current budget. He further stated the Borough could look at putting more waste receptacles at the site and crack sealing the current surface.

Mr. Dillinger stated the Borough would have to look at what the cost would be to put a new surface on the court before any decisions could be made.

Mr. McCabe, Public Works Supervisor, indicated the projected cost would be approximately \$30,000.00. He stated he was basing the project on the cost of resurfacing the Bishop Playground last fall.

Mr. Petro stated the Borough would have to make sure the subsurface of the court area was good before resurfacing. He stated some of the smaller issues, such as sealing the cracks and additional waste receptacles, might be able to be addressed this year.
