

**MINUTES OF THE REGULAR MEETING  
OF WHITE OAK BOROUGH COUNCIL  
HELD MONDAY, AUGUST 15, 2016 AT 8:00 P.M.**

**CALL TO ORDER**

Mr. Massung, President of Council, called the Regular Meeting to order at 8:00 p.m.

**PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE**

The Pledge of Allegiance was given.

**ROLL CALL**

Attending were Council members: Edward Babyak, Richard Bryce, Charles Davis, Ronald Massung, Joseph Nagy, and Ken Robb. Also attending were Mayor Ina Marton, Solicitor Krisha DiMascio, Daniel Coffman, Engineer Representative and Borough Secretary Nancy Greenland.

Council member David Pasternak was absent.

**MINUTES**

None submitted for approval at this time.

**EXECUTIVE SESSION**

Mrs. DiMascio stated an Executive Session was held at the Workshop Session and before this meeting at which time personnel matters were discussed.

**PUBLIC COMMENTS**

Edward Scott – 1470 Craig Drive, North Huntingdon, PA 15642

Mr. Scott stated he applied for a permit to construct a garage and was advised it application needed to go before the Zoning Hearing Board. He was required to pay a fee of \$350.00 to file the application plus \$1,000.00 escrow. He asked what services/fees were covered by the application fee. He stated if the Borough charges close to \$2,000 for this no one will want to build anything in the Borough.

Ms. DiMascio advised Mr. Scott when she spoke with him earlier today she stated she would check out as to when the \$350.00 and \$1,000.00 fees were effective and get back to him. She further noted the Borough has no control over the Zoning Hearing Board.

Jonathan Stark – 1664 Fawcett Avenue, White Oak, PA 15131

Mr. Stark indicated that several years ago he inquired about purchasing 806 Maple Street (old municipal/ems building), but nothing ever came of it.

Ms. DiMascio stated Council did discuss this during the workshop session and there may be a clause in the deed that requires the property to be given back to the deeding foundation if it is no longer used for municipal purposes. This will be reviewed.

If the Borough does decide to sell the property it must go through a public bid process.

Mr. Stark indicated he was pleased to see the house at 120 Congress was razed. He noted he was interested in purchasing the lot.

Ms. DiMascio noted the Borough does not own the parcel and suggested he contact the property owner regarding a private sell or he could go through the county's vacant land program to purchase it.

Mr. Stark stated he felt that was too expensive.

Ms. DiMascio advised the Borough recently approved joining a Land Banking program which is being sponsored by two local COGs. She noted this program should start up next year.

Kurt Pawlak – 133 Penn Crest Circle, White Oak, PA 15131

Mr. Pawlak stated five (5) years ago the road was paved and it is starting to crack with sections that are pulling up. He stated he did not want to see it go to the point of deterioration it was in before it was paved (yrs. ago). He suggested the Borough put a program in place to keep the roads in shape.

Ms. DiMascio advised she met with Mr. McCabe today and this issue was discussed, about establishing a multi-year schedule. She indicated the Borough relies on the foreman to evaluate the road and determine what needs resurfaced/repared.

David Bradley – 2514 Mohawk Drive, White Oak, PA 15131

Mr. Bradley suggested the Borough consider purchasing a digital sign for meeting announcements since we no longer have a local newspaper.

Ms. DiMascio indicated the local Rotary has proposed such a project, but we don't have a location to erect the sign.
