MINUTES OF THE REGULAR MEETING OF WHITE OAK BOROUGH COUNCIL HELD MONDAY, SEPTEMBER 18, 2017 AT 8:00 P.M.

CALL TO ORDER

Mr. Massung, President of Council, called the Regular Meeting to order at 8:00 p.m.

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

The Pledge of Allegiance was given.

ROLL CALL

Attending were Council members: Edward Babyak, Richard Bryce, Charles Davis, Ronald Massung, Joseph Nagy, David Pasternak and Kenneth Robb. Also attending were, Mayor Ina Marton, Borough manager John Palyo, Solicitor Michael Hammond, Engineer Michael Glister, Borough Secretary Nancy Greenland.

MINUTES

EXECUTIVE SESSION

Mr. Hammond stated an Executive Session was held after prior to this meeting at which time personnel matters as well as potential litigation were discussed.

PUBLIC COMMENTS

Josh Curry – 50 Lake Drive, Rilton, PA

Mr. Curry noted he and his wife have taken over the wife's grandparents' house (2021 Fawcett Avenue) and they recently found out there were borough and school real estate taxes owing on the property. He noted he spoke with the borough's tax collector and was advised to contact the delinquent collector. Contact was made but, the delinquent collector was not receipt to his request to find out why they had not received any prior notices of delinquent taxes. He stated he was looking for relief on the penalty and interest charges. He noted that nothing was brought up at the closing and they did not secure title insurance.

Mr. Robb asked if there were any assets from the estate and that sometimes when a property transfers between family members a title search is not completed.

Mr. Curry noted the estate was left to 5 family members and there were no assets other than the house.

Mr. Davis asked what years were delinquent.

Page 1 of 10 Regular Meeting September 18, 2017 Mr. Curry stated it is for years 2014 and 2015.

Mr. Robb asked Mr. Curry when the closing was.

Mr. Curry stated the property was already sold.

Mr. Robb asked if the closing officer held the unpaid taxes.

Mr. Curry stated the unpaid taxes were withheld, 1,159.00 for the borough and 3,075.40 for the school.

Mr. Pasternak noted he was unaware of Council ever granting exemption from penalty and interest charges on delinquent real estate taxes.

Mr. Hammond noted this is something that is rarely done and that he did not feel it should be granted since the property has sold

Mr. Bryce stated he did not feel this could be done.

Mr. Curry thanked the officials for their time.

George Matta – 1527 California Ave.

Mr. Matta stated he was interested in knowing how much taxpayer money and grant money has been put into the new community center as well as why after a year it has not been opened. He further noted he felt the public had the right to know this information.

Mr. Massung noted there were many reasons it facility been opened as yet; there have been delays as well as construction issues. The borough continues to work on resolving these issues. He advised the Borough hopes to make arrangements to secure an Occupancy Certificate for the site within the next week or so.

Mr. Matta asked if the construction issues were public information.

Mr. Pasternak stated there is the possibility of potential litigation

Mr. Hammond stated due to the potential litigation, these matters are not public at this time.

Mr. Matta asked why there wasn't a fire suppression system installed during construction.

Mr. Massung noted based on the size of the facility such a system was not necessary. He indicated the facility is close to being ready for occupancy and should be so within another month or so.

Mr. Matta asked if the construction issues would be public after litigation was started.

Page 2 of 10 Regular Meeting September 18, 2017 Mr. Hammond stated at that point it would be public information. The Borough is currently in the process of looking at each issue and trying to resolve it. If litigation is filed the Borough would hope to have the other parties held responsible and recoup the additional costs of the project. He noted that within the next month or so the borough should know what direction it is going and at that point it could be discussed more publicly.

Mr. Matta noted the Agenda for the Regular meeting doesn't have much on it. He asked if residents were interested in knowing what was going on what meeting to attend. The Regular Meeting or the Workshop Meeting.

Mr. Massung noted discussions are held at both types of meetings and these are opened to the public. There are very few motions that are acted upon at the workshop meetings.

Mr. Matta indicated that Mr. Bryce goes out of town for multiple months in the winter and suggested that he not be in charge of the Public Works Department during these busy months with winter weather. He asked how Mr. Bryce could supervise the department when he is not in town.

Mr. Massung noted that Mr. Bryce stays in touch with various council members and the department by phone.

Mr. Massung had nothing to report at this time.
